

BENJAMIN TAYLOR is the author, most recently, of a family memoir, *The Hue and Cry at Our House*. He has also published *Proust: The Search*, named a Best Book of 2016 by Thomas Mallon in *The New York Times Book Review*; *Naples Declared: A Walk Around the Bay*, named a Best Book of 2012 by Judith Thurman in *The New Yorker*; and two award-winning novels, *Tales Out of School* and *The Book of Getting Even*. He previously edited *Saul Bellow: Letters*, named a Best Book of 2010 by Michiko Kakutani in *The New York Times* and Jonathan Yardley in *The Washington Post*, and *Saul Bellow: There Is Simply Too Much to Think About: Collected Nonfiction*. A faculty member in the New School's Graduate School of Writing, Taylor also teaches in the Graduate Writing Division of the School of the Arts at Columbia University. A past fellow and current trustee of the John Simon Guggenheim Memorial Foundation, he has recently been named president of the Edward F. Albee Foundation.




